How are personal research activities reflected in teaching activities?	<p>My personal research in anthropology of global health, hospital ethnography, and urban anthropology (particularly in relation to mobility/transportation experience) not only provides substantive content for my medical and urban anthropology-related courses, but also directly informs my instruction in writing ethnography and ethnographic research methods courses. For example, insights gained from my research provide concrete examples for illustrating socio-political and cultural nuances of health intervention. Similarly, my work on urban transportation in Indonesia informs my lectures on social and spatial inequalities as well embodied urban mobility experiences. My own fieldwork experiences - from initial research design to data collection and the eventual write-up - also directly shape the practical guidance and examples I offer students both in class and in final project supervision, including on discussions related to navigating complex research settings.</p>
